PROGRAM DESCRIPTION AND TARGET AUDIENCE

Steven R. Hall, MD, died tragically as a result of a bicycle accident on Aug. 13, 1983. During his brief and promising career, he was an attending orthopaedic surgeon at Truman Medical Center and Saint Luke's Hospital. He actively participated in their orthopaedic residency programs and enthusiastically supported the developing trauma program at Saint Luke's Hospital. The Steven R. Hall Memorial Lectureship was established in 1987 in conjunction with the First Annual Midwest Trauma Conference and in 1997 the first annual Steven R. Hall, MD Trauma Symposium was held at Big Cedar Lodge. This year marks the 17th anniversary for the Steven R. Hall Trauma Symposium.

This three-day trauma conference offers continuing trauma education opportunities for physicians, nurses, pre-hospital and others caring for trauma patients. The symposium will provide education related to emergency care in the Midwest. Presentations will address topics related to rural challenges, envenomation, wilderness medicine, EMS strategies, aeromedical transfers, obstetric trauma, trauma research, armed intruders and active shooters, digital reimplantation, liver injuries, rib plating, arterial trauma, traumatic brain injury, urban survival, surgical intensive care unit, emergency department thoracotomy and thermal injuries.

This activity is jointly sponsored by Saint Luke's Hospital of Kansas City, Barnes-Jewish Hospital in St. Louis, Washington University in St. Louis, CoxHealth in Springfield, and University of Missouri Health Care in Columbia, Mo.
