Who Should Attend

This national multidisciplinary conference is designed for all healthcare professionals involved with the care of injured children, including surgeons, emergency medicine physicians, nurse practitioners, nurses, physician assistants, pre-hospital providers and social workers.

Objectives

- Discuss how trauma affects the physical and emotional future of the pediatric patient.
- Identify strategic measures to reduce the incidence of pediatric traumatic injuries.
