GRADE Workshop

August 2-3, 2018, New York Academy of Medicine

The New York Academy of Medicine (NYAM) will offer an intensive 2 day workshop experience in the use of the GRADE system for clinical guideline development. The workshop is a concentrated version of previous NYAM workshops. It is ideal for members of organizations that are developing clinical guidelines as well as consultants, methodologists and epidemiologists connected to such efforts. The 2-day workshop will offer participants hands on training in the use of the GRADE system.

By the end of the training, participants will have learned:

1. How to formulate guideline questions around patient important outcomes
2. How to reformat evidence from a systematic review to conform to GRADE specifications
3. How to evaluate the quality of the evidence using GRADE
4. How to use the GRADE guideline development tool GRADEPRO.org to create evidence profile
5. How to use "Evidence to Decision" frameworks that facilitate moving from evidence to recommendations

This workshop is open to individuals in settings requiring formulation of health care recommendations for national, regional or local use. It is strongly recommended that GRADE group participants be familiar with basic principles of critical appraisal of clinical studies conforming to commonly encountered designs, and with appraisal and interpretation of systematic reviews.

Dr. Eddy Lang MD. Dr. Lang is the Academic and Clinical Department Head for Emergency Medicine at the Cumming School of Medicine, University of Calgary, Alberta, Canada. He is an experienced member of the GRADE Working Group and has taught the GRADE system to health professionals and guideline developers within national and international organizations. He has served as a GRADE methodologist for the WHO, the International Liaison Committee on Resuscitation the National Highway Transportation Safety Agency and the American Society of Hematology. He is also a member of the Canadian Task Force for Preventive Health Care.

John J. Riva, DC, MSc (epi) Dr. Riva is an Assistant Clinical Professor in the Department of Family Medicine at McMaster University, Ontario, Canada. His clinical focus is in musculoskeletal conditions in primary care. He is a member of the GRADE working group and an associate member of Cochrane Canada. He has contributed to clinical guideline groups using GRADE internationally, including the World Health Organization (WHO), World Allergy Organization (WAO), Kingdom of Saudi Arabia Ministry of Health, American Society of Hematology (ASH), American College of Physicians (ACP), Allergic Rhinitis and its Impact on Asthma (ARIA), Canadian National Pain Centre, and Canadian Task Force on Preventive Health Care (CTFPHC).
